Jump Start Your Orientation Experience

The University of Alberta offers summer Orientation programs for families, parents, and students who want extra information before Orientation 2013 in September. If you are a student that

also identifies as an international student, a student living in Lister, or an Aboriginal student, make sure to also register for your additional applicable Orientation programs listed below!

Family Orientation

University a big step for you, and it's a big deal for your family as well! Family Orientation, on Saturday, **July 20**, has separate programming for students, and parents and guardians. You will learn about the transition to post-secondary life, while your parents will learn how to best support you.

Family Orientation also gives you the opportunity to try out living in residence. On Friday, **July 19**, families can attend a Residence Services orientation and spend the night in Lister Centre before attending the rest of Family Orientation the next day.

Parent Orientation

Parent Orientation is a program for parents and guardians only, designed to provide them with the tools to support a student throughout their post-secondary education. It provides an opportunity to learn about the transition and to meet other parents in an environment without their students present. Parent Orientation is a one-day workshop that will be held on Saturday, **August 17**.

Pre-Orientation

Orientation asks you: What do you want to start? This year's Pre-Orientation program will give you the tools to start a campaign on campus, effectively brand yourself, or simply meet other students in a smaller setting. Pre-Orientation happens this year on **August 9**.


