I would like to make you aware that we had no idea that this was happening. Robin Hansen is in charge of the news letters and did not inform Mark or I that this was going to be added on.

I hope where Mark is not running against anyone that the ramifications are not to severe. MPH would be happy to send out another email with all the other candidates info if that would help remedy the situation.

The document attached the email contained 1,245 email addresses.

3. Robin Hansen, MPH listserv administrator, confirmed via email the number of subscribers on the MPH mailing list to be 1,245 in an email to the C.R.O. provided at 18:48 September 23, 2012.

Ruling





- 1. All candidates are required to read, understand, and comply with all Rules & Regulations and Bylaws and were informed as such in the nomination package and at the mandatory candidates meeting. Mark McCormack was represented at the mandatory candidates' meeting as per Bylaw 2300 s.10 (2).
- Rules & Regulations s.3.17 states that mass emails to unofficial groups are not permitted. Emails to official University and student group mailing lists will be considered provided specified procedures are adhered to. The policy was not adhered to with regard to the alleged contravention.
- 3. The C.R.O. is satisfied that Mark McCormack has met the requirements of Bylaw 2300 s.19 (Third Party Activities). No punitive fine shall be recommended. In addition, the C.R.O. is satisfied that Mark McCormack has also met the conditions stipulated in Bylaw 2300 s.18(1)(c).
- 4. The Schedule of Fines and Penalties affixed to the nomination package denotes that a counterbalancing fine of \$10.00 + \$0.10 per individual reached will be levied against the contravening party for unsolicited campaigning (including mass emails).
- 5. It is reasonable to assume that not every email recipient is enrolled in the faculty of Open Studies. The C.R.O. has no method of confirming the exact number of students enrolled in the faculty of Open Studies who received the email. The C.R.O. will use a faculty distribution among the 1,245 recipients that mirrors the actual faculty distribution among all undergraduate students at the University of Alberta. As per enrollment numbers on September 18th, 2012 there are 31,400 undergraduate students at the University of Alberta, 1,056 of which are enrolled in the faculty of Open Studies; or 3.36%. Therefore the estimated number of Open Studies students who have received this email is 42 (0.0336*1,245 = 41.8; rounded up to 42).
- 6. This results in \$10.00 plus \$0.10*42 = \$4.20 for a total of \$14.20. The C.R.O. appreciates that the Mark McCormack campaign was forthcoming in providing information and expediently contacted the C.R.O. regarding the contravention. No punitive fine shall be recommended.
- 7. Mark McCormack will be levied a \$14.20 fine against the candidate budget.
