Course Code and Instructor	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Indicate the number of your course eg. Eng 101 The name of the instructor teaching the course
Clearance Reference Number (if applicable)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> You may copy more than 15% of a work with prior permission from Access Copyright. If a work is out-of-print, Access can give you permission to copy 100% of the work. Contact the Copyright and Licensing Office at 492-0151 to assist with this process. Allow sufficient time (approx. 1 week) to obtain the number.
Textbook Yes or No	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Indicate if the material you are covering is a textbook or not. You may copy no more than 5% of any 'in-print' textbook per term
Author(s) of Excerpt and Work	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Full names of the author(s) of the article or book being copied Full names of the editors if the work is in an anthology i.e. Erna Paris, Douglas Fetherling DO NOT use the phrase 'et.al.' or use initials in the place of first names
Complete Title	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Indicate the complete title of the work you intend to copy Name of the book/periodical "Name of the article/section copied" in quotes i.e. "The Boat People: The Toronto Voyage" in <i>Best Canadian Essays</i>, 1990 If the section being copied doesn't have a name, simply record the name of the book.
Full Name of Publisher and Date of Publication	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Books: the year of publication can be found near the ISBN number and the publisher will be listed near the first few pages. Periodicals: the date of publication includes volume, number, year, date – whatever is available. The publisher can usually be found on the masthead. Include the full name of the publisher. Make sure the publisher is not on the Post Secondary Exclusions List.
ISBN/ISSN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> International Standard Book Number and I.S. Serial Number Every publication has a unique ISBN/ISSN number Books: this number is found at the front with the year of publication, publisher data etc. Periodicals: (magazines/journals/newspapers) this number is found on the masthead (where the publisher and address are listed)
Total Pages in Publication	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Books: Indicate the number of pages in the entire book (i.e. 322 pages) Periodicals: Do not need to fill in this column – simply indicate (J) for Journal; (M) for magazine or (N) for newspaper
Original Pages Copied	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The actual page numbers of the pages you are copying If the pages are broken up, please make this obvious i.e.: 23, 25, 26-30, 32, 34-37
Total Original Pages Copied	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The pages in the "original pages copied" column are inclusive so remember to add one when you are subtracting. In the example above, 12 pages were copied. i.e. 14–23 = 10 pages; 1-5 = 5 pages
Number of Sets	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The number of actual copies of the article or book section that were made. This number is usually based on student enrolment plus two for administrative purposes i.e. 10 students + 2 instructors = 12 copies
Total Pages Copied	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Automatically calculated on the Excel spreadsheet Multiply the two previous columns "Total Original pages Copied" x "Number of Sets" i.e. 15 pages x 12 copies = 180 sheets
Royalties @ \$0.64/page	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Automatically calculated on the Excel spreadsheet Multiply the previous column by the tariff rate (\$.064/page) "Total Pages Copied" x royalty rate i.e. 180 sheets x \$0.64/page = \$11.52
% Copied	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> This column automatically calculated the percentage you copied. If you are above 15% and it is not one of the following, please modify your content to comply with the 15% limit <ul style="list-style-type: none"> > one entire article from a Journal, Magazine or Periodical > an entire chapter up to 20% of a book > up to 5% of a textbook Cumulative copying exceeding the above percentages during a course term is not permissible
