

Values Game

Start using your money for the things you care about most

To start this activity you will be given some fake money and cards with pictures and words on them.

Each word/picture represents a value. Simply put, a value is something that is important to you.

The dollar value with the word is the price at the local store, run by the facilitator. You can trade or sell the words to others.

There will be items in the store at the front of the room. Certain items from the store can only be bought with cash for the face value (the value on the card).

If you receive a blank card, you can write any word on it that you want.

The objective of the game is to get the items that are important to you or that you value the most.

Once you have finished the activity, list the words in order of importance in the chart below.



You may have noticed all the cards, except the blank ones, have different colored dots on them...

Cards with green dots involve financial security or earning money	
Cards with blue dots are activities or socializing	
Cards with yellow dots are beliefs, feelings, and learning	
Cards with red dots are products or services	

Find out how many cards you have with a certain colored dot in each category and write it in the corresponding blank above. If you get a blank card, you get to decide what color it will be.
