## UNIVERSITY BUDGET OPERATING VS. CONSOLIDATED


CONSOLIDATED BUDGET	OPERATING	Revenue: grants, <b>tuition/fees</b> , investment, etc.  Expense: salaries & benefits, utilities, etc.
	ANCILLARY	Self-financing units. e.g. Bookstore, Residences and Parking
	CAPITAL	Restricted. Funded by Province, donations, mortgages for capital projects, e.g. NINT
	RESTRICTED (RESEARCH)	External funding for restricted activities. e.g. sponsored research and contracts






#### **OPERATING BUDGET, 2011-12**







2006	Tuition regulation amended •tuition capped at 2004 rates •limits tuition increases to Alberta's Consumer Price Index (CPI)	
2009-10	Development of market modifier proposals to address market anomalies.	
	Consultation with student association, faculties and government.	
March 2010	Board approval of market modifier proposal	
April 2010	AET approves select market modifiers  •Bachelor of Commerce, Engineering, Graduate Studies and Pharmacy	
Sept 2011	Implementation of market modifiers

## PROVINCIAL TUITION REGULATION

- Applies to tuition for courses and mandatory fees for materials and services that facilitate instruction of courses
- Allowable increase based on year over year average increase in Alberta Consumer Price Index (July 1 to June 30)
  - → 1.45% for 2012-13





That the Board of Governors approve a proposal from the University Administration for a general tuition fee increase of 1.45% effective September 1, 2012.


