Chancellor's Pride Parade

This monday, I and the other executives attended the Chancellor's Pride Parade. This parade marked the start of UofAs Pride Week. It was great to be among members of the University community in displaying pride for 2SLGBTQIA+ students. Queer visibility is important but just as important is ensuring our campus community is safe and open for all queer students. While much more needs to be done, it was a great day to be reminded of the progress that had been achieved and to fight against rising homophobia and transphobia. In attendance were also MLA Janis Irwin, President Flanagan and many departments and offices of the University.

Tuition Protest Info Session

With more awareness and justified frustration and anger towards the proposed tuition increases, it was important to get more students mobilized and attend the protest info session. It was great to see the creativity and hard work students were putting to fight back against tuition increases. I continue to ask for Council's support in spreading the message and inviting the friends and classmates. I am grateful for all the info shared so far.

Meeting with Minister Rajan Sawhney

It has been clear that more support is needed for International students. From rapidly rising tuition to slow processing times and supporting pathways to PR after graduation. This is why CAUS met with the Minister of Trade, Immigration and Multiculturalism, Rajan Sawhney. During this meeting I raised the importance of the Minister putting pressure on the Federal government to extend the pilot program on work hours as well as ensure that the issues of visa processing are not repeated like this year. Additionally we also discussed the need to improve Alberta Provincial Immigration Nomination Entrepreneurship stream to provide expanded eligibility for International students that does not require having to own a business.
